# What are the points of view? perspective

---

- How would you think or feel about what happens if you were in this story?
- How would someone you know think or feel about what happens in this story?
- How might the characters feel in this story?

# What is our responsibility? responsibility

- This story makes me want to....
- If this happened to me, what would I do?
- If this happened to a friend, what would I want to do?
- What can I do so that this does/doesn't happen?

# Why is it like it is? causation

---

- Why do you think things happened the way they did in this story?
- What do you think the consequences might be?

# How does it work? function

---

- Does this book teach a lesson?
- Why did the author write this book?

# How is it changing? change

---

- How do the characters change in this story?
- How could the end of the story change?
- How would the story change if the setting or characters were different?

# How is it connected to other things? connection

---

- How is it like another story, book or T.V. program?
- Do these characters remind me of others that I know?
- How are characters in the story like each other?
- This story makes me think of....

# How do we know? reflection

---

- Would I recommend this book to a friend? Why?
- Are there things in this story that I think are "right" or "wrong"?
- This story makes me want to learn more about...
- What would I change in the story if I were the author?
